



## Assembly Steps <u>Overview</u> Back Cushion(H+I) Backrest Cushion(F+G) Sofa Backrest(C) Arm Pillow(J) Left Arm(D) Right Arm(E) Sofa Base (A) Seat Cushion(B) **FRONT FACING** Wooden Leg(L) Metal Leg(K) This Sofa has multiple parts and may require about 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Sofa parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.








Then secure the Sofa Base(A) to the Sofa arms using Bolts(③), Spring Washers(⑤) and Washers(④) with the Allen Wrench(⑥).

## Do not over tighten.

Note: The bottom of the Sofa Base(A) must be aligned with the bottom of the armrests.




Using the Allen Wrench(<sup>®</sup>) secure the Sofa Base(A) to the front-bottom of the Sofa Backrest(C) with the Bolts(<sup>©</sup>), Spring Rings(<sup>©</sup>)and Washers(<sup>@</sup>).

Insert all 6 Bolts(②) half-way starting one by one as pictured.

Then completely tighten the Bolts(<sup>(2)</sup>) together with Bolts(<sup>(3)</sup>) in Step 6 using the Allen Wrench(<sup>(6)</sup>).

Close the non-woven fabric under the Sofa Base(A) along the Magic Tape.




Attach the Metal Legs(K) to the Sofa Base(A) using Bolts(①), Spring Washers(③) and Washers(④) with the Allen Wrench((⑥).


Tighten the Bolts fully in a sequential manner.

Install the Middle Wooden Leg(L) onto the bottom of the Sofa Base(A) by placing one Gasket on the threaded stem.

Tighten by turning the Leg clockwise.

Note: The use of Gaskets are OPTIONAL and are especially useful to help alleviate slight wobbles.

## Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

· What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

· What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
